


## MISTY DAY AT KANYANA WILDLIFE REHAB CENTER

Kanyana Wildlife Rehabilitation Centre is a not-for-profit organisation dedicated to wildlife conservation. They care for sick, injured, orphaned, and displaced wildlife; breed threatened species; conduct training and research; and educate schools and community. Located in a beautiful national park surrounded by jarrah forest in the Perth Hills, Kanyana resides on a large property donated by the government back in 2010.

On the 16th May, one of the Woodside Drilling & Completions teams spent the day volunteering at Kanyana. Despite the gloomy and wet weather, the team spent the day working hard assist the regular Kanyana volunteers with the upkeep and maintenance of the grounds and animal habitats.

To start the day, the team broke in to small groups of 3-5 and were allocated to a variety of different tasks including sifting through the sand in the Bilbie enclosures, cleaning old mulch out of the Rainbow Lorikeet and Black and Red Cockatoo aviaries and cleaning the possum enclosure.

As the rain started to get heavier so the team stopped for a morning tea break. When they team returned from their break, ready to get back into it a heavy fog had rolled out, hanging around for about an hour before disappearing in seconds!

For the second half of the day, Kanyana Hospital Manager Tasha, tasked one of the groups with the challenge of re-designing a Tawny Frogmouth cage to accommodate a baby possum once it is ready to leave the hospital. Team members put their engineering skills to use to re-assess the logistics of the cage to allow one of the doors to close to create a barrier between the Tawny Frogmouth and the possum. The group then got creative designing and decorating the new enclosure.
