Spectrum Committee gets packing at WA AIDS Council

The WA Aids Council (WAAC) aims to minimise the impact and further transmission of HIV, other blood borne viruses and sexually transmissible infections. To reduce social, legal and policy barriers which prevent access to health information and effective support and prevention services. Members of Woodside's Spectrum committee spent the morning putting together safe sex packs for Pride month and condom boxes to be sent to regional towns.

While the team was busy packing, WAAC employee and educator Tyler put on a very educational and engaging presentation on the history, treatment and prevention of HIV/AIDS.

Each year, WAAC distributes 90-110 thousand safe sex packs/condoms throughout WA. In the 3 hours the team spent volunteering they packaged a massive 3,500 condoms!
